BRINGING AND PICKING UP EXHIBITS

Horticulture and Floriculture:

The Exhibitor Entrance Gate, located on North Park Dr. just west of the Fair's North Gate, can be used by Horticulture/Floriculture Exhibitors when bringing exhibits to the Fair during regular Fair hours. All Horticulture/Floriculture exhibitors will be required to use this gate when entering their exhibits starting WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 5.

Exhibitors will NOT be required to pay admission to the fairgrounds, but will have to exit the grounds through the same gate after their exhibits have been entered. Anyone wishing to stay on the fairgrounds must enter through one of the regular entry gates. The Exhibitor Entry gate will be open from 7:30 to 10:00 a.m. on WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 5, and from 7:00 to 10:30 a.m. on FRIDAY, AUGUST 7. NOTE: The Exhibitor Entrance Gate is a WALK-IN GATE ONLY, no vehicles.

Please check the grounds map for Exhibitor Gate location. The map is available at washmofair.com/fairgrounds-map.

Home Economics and Fine Arts:

Home Ec./Fine Arts exhibitors may use the North Gate to drop off their pre-registered exhibits. All Home Ec./Fine Arts exhibits must be registered by July 18, and brought to the Exhibitor Building on MONDAY, AUGUST 3, 6:30-8:00 p.m., or TUESDAY, AUGUST 4, 8:00-10:00 a.m. When picking up exhibits in the evening hours on Sunday, August 9, exhibitors must enter through the regular gates. Admission WILL be required. Exhibits may also be picked up after the Fair, Monday, August 10, from 9-10 a.m., but no premiums vouchers will be available.

HORTICULTURE / FLORICULTURE DIVISION

Rules and Regulations

- All entries must be garden grown by the exhibitor unless otherwise stated.
- **There are no entry fees, but beginning in 2026, PRE-REGISTRATION IS REQUIRED!**
- Exhibitors will be allowed to enter exhibits without paying admission, but all entries must be brought in through the Exhibitor Entry Gate.
- Flower, Houseplant, and Garden Show (Produce, Houseplants, and Specimens), and Friday's shows are open to gardeners of all ages. The Junior Divisions are open to exhibitors ages 15 and under only.
- Each entry must have an entry tag attached. A limit of 10 tags will be sent on request or more may be picked up at the Washington Area Chamber of Commerce. Only one entry per class, except where noted.
- Exhibitors must identify containers if valued. Due caution will be exercised in safeguarding exhibits and containers, but neither the Floriculture Division nor the Town & Country Fair will be held responsible for damage or loss.
- Exhibits should be clean, but no polish or foreign substance on flowers or leaves will be permitted.

Entries/Show Times

- Flower, Houseplant, and Garden Produce Show entries will be accepted on WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 5, 7:30-10:00 a.m. ONLY. Produce and Houseplants must remain through 5:00 p.m. on SUNDAY, AUGUST 9. Flowers must be removed at 7:00 a.m. on FRIDAY, AUGUST 7 if you desire to keep your blooms.
- Arrangement, Terrarium, Succulent Garden, and Fairy Garden Show entries will be accepted on FRIDAY, AUGUST 7 between 8:00 and 10:30 a.m. and must remain until 5:00 p.m. SUNDAY, AUGUST 9. Produce, Houseplants, Fairy Gardens, Terrariums, Herb Gardens, and Arrangements may also be picked up MONDAY, AUGUST 10 between 9:00 and 9:45 a.m.

Judging

- Judging will begin on all exhibits immediately following entry deadline for each show.
- Entries receive a blue, red, or white ribbon according to merit.
- Appearance of exhibits is important. Points will be deducted for insect damage. Proportion of flower to stem and foliage and position in container all contribute to being a prize winner.
- Classes in any section may be subdivided at the discretion of the judges.
- Decision of the judges will be final.

Awards

- Award presentations and photos of winners from the Horticulture/Floriculture Shows will take place at 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, August 8 in the Exhibitor Building.
- Payment vouchers may be picked up at the Exhibitor Building on Friday, August 7, from 5:00-10:00 p.m., Saturday, August 8, 6:00-8:00 p.m. and on Sunday, August 9 from 5:00-7:00 p.m. No vouchers or premiums will be available after this time.

3. Online registration is available at www.washmofair.com beginning May 1. Paper forms are available at the Washington Area Chamber of Commerce office or at www.washmofair.com. Items to be entered must be listed on the form; exhibitors are limited to one form with a maximum of 30 entries only. Items not entered into the correct category may be disqualified.
4. Barcoded entry tags will be printed by the Fair Office for Exhibitors and available for pick-up starting Wednesday, July 22 at the Fairgrounds Administration Building. Exhibitors are strongly encouraged to pick up tags prior to entry drop-off. Entries must have the correct barcoded tag attached to be checked in. A special consideration registration tag can be given for projects completed by entrants with special needs. Tags will be marked accordingly upon request.
5. All entries for Home Economics and Fine Arts classes must be brought to the fairgrounds **MONDAY, AUGUST 3, 6:30-8:00 p.m.** or **TUESDAY, AUGUST 4, 8:00-10:00 a.m.** Entry tag must be attached to the exhibit at the time of entry.

Rules
